The intention of the Modern Foreign Languages (MFL) Curriculum at Beaulieu Village Primary School is to enable children to communicate practically in another language. The teaching of French and Spanish provides an appropriate balance of spoken and written language and lays the foundations for further foreign language teaching. At Beaulieu School, we feel that the earlier a child is exposed to a foreign language, the faster the language in question is acquired. We believe that the early acquisition of French and Spanish will facilitate the learning of other foreign languages later in life. We have adapted our language curriculum using the Language Angels scheme to support the teaching of French and Spanish. This is based on the National Curriculum.	At Beaulieu Village Primary school, we teach French and Spanish as our Modern Foreign Language in KS2. It is taught in a whole-class setting, using the Language Angels scheme of work. Teachers follow the sequence of lessons from this programme which is adapted to suit our pupils covering a wide variety of topics and themes. Each lesson allows the children to access the new vocabulary taught through listening materials and visual clues. It contains various fun activities, games, songs and challenges for the children to train their listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills. Each lesson is accompanied by appropriate activities, which are scaffolded so that all children can succeed.	Our MFL curriculum ensures that all pupils develop key language learning skills set out by the national curriculum, as well as a love of languages and learning about other cultures. Through the teaching of French and Spanish, we will see the impact of the subject in the following ways: Children will become aware that a language has a structure, and that the structure differs from one language to another. Children will develop their language and communication through the development of speaking, listening, reading and writing. Children will transfer to KS3 effectively and successfully and will be well prepared to continue and develop their language skills. Children will enrich their language learning by developing an understanding of the French and Spanish cultures.	

We intend to provide a high-quality MFL education which fosters pupil curiosity and deepens the understanding of world cultures. All pupils are taught essential aspects of vocabulary, spoken and written language, grammar and an appreciation of language differences. MFL should enable pupils to understand and communicate ideas, facts and feelings in both speech and writing, using a knowledge of phonology, grammatical structures and vocabulary.		
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
