<b>Key Knowledge</b>	-A <b>Christian</b> child will often go to <b>church</b> -They show they belong by taking part in activities there -Activities can be singing, listening to stories, Sunday school, going to a <b>service</b> -The <b>Christian</b> special book is called the <b>Bible</b> -The <b>Bible</b> has stories about stories about <b>Jesus</b> in it.	- <b>Christians</b> celebrate the birth of <b>Jesus</b> on <b>Christmas Day</b> -They remember how he was born in <b>Bethlehem</b> a long time ago and think about this at <b>Christmas</b> -They tell the <b>Nativity</b> story as a way of reminding themselves about how <b>Jesus</b> was born -They celebrate by sending cards that remind others about the birth of Jesus, going to special <b>Christmas services</b> , singing <b>hymns</b> about <b>Jesus</b> , having a <b>crib</b> displayed at home and giving presents. -There are many other ways they may choose to celebrate too	- <b>Jesus</b> told many <b>stories</b> to help his followers learn -He told <b>stories about God</b> and about how to behave -These <b>stories</b> show how <b>God</b> looks after people -They also show how <b>Christians</b> should care for others	- <b>Easter</b> is a very important <b>Christian</b> festival -Christians tell the <b>Easter</b> story to remind them about how <b>Jesus</b> died and then <b>rose again</b> - <b>Christians</b> celebrate <b>Jesus' new life</b> on <b>Easter Sunday</b> and give <b>Easter</b> eggs as a sign of <b>new life</b> .	- <b>Christians</b> have many special things -These might include a <b>cross</b> , a <b>Bible</b> , pictures of <b>Jesus</b> - <b>Jewish</b> people have many special things too -These might include a copy of the <b>Jewish special book</b> ; the <b>Hebrew Bible</b> and going to see the <b>Torah scrolls</b> in the <b>synagogue</b>	- <b>Christians</b> use water in a special ceremony called <b>baptism</b> which welcomes people into the church -Babies or adults can be <b>baptised</b> -Babies and adults often wear special clothing -Christians tell the story of <b>John of Baptist</b> who <b>baptised Jesus</b> in the river <b>Jordan</b> - <b>Hindus</b> see the <b>River Ganges</b> as <b>precious</b> . They travel a long way to bathe in the water - <b>Hindus</b> tell the story of <b>Shiva</b> who let the <b>River Ganges</b> flow through his hair

<b>Key Knowledge</b>	- <b>Christians</b> celebrate the food they have at <b>Harvest</b> time in the Autumn -At <b>Harvest</b> , many <b>Christians</b> go to church to celebrate in a special <b>Harvest service</b> -They sing songs, <b>pray</b> and often give to <b>charity</b> to help others without food.	-Candles are used to remember someone or something -A <b>Hannukiah</b> is a special <b>Jewish menorah</b> lamp to remind <b>Jews</b> of the <b>miracle</b> of the oil at <b>Hanukkah</b> -It has 9 candles, one for each night of the 8 nights of the <b>festival of Hanukkah</b> plus a <b>helper candle</b> -The <b>festival of Hannukah</b> celebrates the <b>belief</b> in the <b>miracle</b> of one small jar of oil lasting 8	- <b>Christians</b> believe that <b>Jesus</b> <b>changed</b> people's lives when he met them. -There are 3 stories in the <b>gospels</b> that we have learnt that show this - <b>Zacchaeus</b> the <b>tax collector</b> was hated by people because of his job. He changed when he met Jesus and gave back what he had stolen from others - <b>Jairus' daughter</b> was <b>brought back to life</b> by Jesus and Jairus changed by <b>believing</b> in Jesus and following him afterwards	-There are <b>sad and happy</b> parts to the <b>Easter</b> story - <b>Jesus</b> had a meal with his <b>disciples</b> to celebrate the <b>Jewish festival of Passover</b> -This is called the <b>Last Supper</b> -The <b>disciples</b> were happy to be together but <b>Jesus</b> was sad as he knew one of them would hand him over to the <b>Roman</b> Soldiers - <b>Jesus</b> was <b>arrested</b> by the soldiers and he was killed	-We all belong to different <b>communities</b> -There are always people who may need help in any community - <b>Dāna</b> is a very important value in <b>Hindu</b> traditions - <b>Dāna</b> involves helping people without expecting anything in return -The story of <b>Karna's generosity</b> shows the value of generosity to others	<b>Shabbat</b> begins every week from sunset on Friday to sunset on Saturday -It is the <b>Jewish</b> day of rest - <b>Shabbat</b> remembers the story of creation from the <b>Torah</b> -The story tells how <b>God</b> <b>created</b> the world in 6 days and rested on the 7 <sup>th</sup> day

		nights instead of 1 night as usual - <b>Christians</b> also use light at <b>Christmas</b> -An example is the <b>Advent ring/wreath</b> which has 4 candles -A candle is lit on each of the 4 Sundays leading up to <b>Christmas</b> -It reminds Christians to <b>wait</b> and prepare for Christmas light	-Jesus brought sight back to the <b>blind</b> man and the man had faith that Jesus could do this. - <b>Christians</b> use these stories to show that Jesus can change the lives of anyone who believes in him.	-His followers came to the place where he was buried but the stone had been rolled away and his body was not there -His followers were happy when <b>Jesus</b> appeared to them some time later - <b>Christians</b> believe from this story that Jesus died and rose again. This is called the <b>resurrection</b> and <b>Christians</b> celebrate this at <b>Easter</b> .

<b>Key Knowledge</b>	- <b>Sukkot</b> is an important celebration for <b>Jewish</b> people -It is the <b>Jewish</b> harvest festival and lasts for a week - <b>Sukkot</b> means Huts - <b>Jews</b> prepare by building and decorating their own special hut called a <b>sukkah</b> -The <b>Sukkah</b> has 3 walls and becomes a part of the home -It reminds Jews of the <b>exodus</b> from <b>Egypt</b> and the dwellings made by <b>Moses</b> and his people who lived for 40 years in the wilderness	-In many stories, the <b>end of the journey</b> is very important -The <b>Christian Nativity</b> story is told in two of the <b>four gospels</b> in the <b>Bible</b> -The story tells how <b>Jesus</b> was born in <b>Bethlehem</b> -In the story, <b>Mary</b> and <b>Joseph</b> travel to <b>Bethlehem</b> and at the end of the journey, <b>Mary</b> gives birth to <b>Jesus</b> -The <b>shepherds</b> also go on a journey to see Jesus and find him at the end of the journey -The <b>magi (wise men)</b> go on a journey to see Jesus and find him at the end of their journey	-The <b>Seder</b> plate helps <b>Jews</b> remember a special story called the <b>Passover</b> -The story of the <b>Passover</b> is found in the <b>Torah</b> , the first five books of the <b>Hebrew scriptures</b> -It is remembered at a special festival of <b>Passover</b> each year - <b>Passover</b> tells the story of how <b>Jews</b> were led out of <b>Egypt</b> and <b>slavery</b> by <b>Moses</b> -The <b>Seder</b> meal has special foods in it to help remember parts of the story: bitter herbs, a lamb bone, celery or parsley, paste made of fruit and nuts and a hard boiled egg	- <b>Welcoming</b> is being polite or friendly to someone who is new -Jesus was <b>Jewish</b> and was in <b>Jerusalem</b> with his friends (disciples) to celebrate the <b>Jewish</b> festival of <b>Passover</b> -He came into Jerusalem riding a horse and he was welcomed by a crowd waving <b>palm leaves</b> at him. -Many people were excited to see him because they knew about him	-People <b>belong</b> to different groups for different reasons -A key way <b>Jewish</b> people feel they belong to their religion is through observing the <b>Shabbat</b> each week -This is a day of rest with no work undertaken -The <b>Shabbat</b> reminds them that G-d created the world in 6 days and on the 7 <sup>th</sup> day G-d rested -It begins every Friday at sunset for 25 hours -A <b>Shabbat</b> meal is eaten on the Friday evening - <b>Shabbat</b> candles are lit, there is a special ceremony to bless the wine or grape juice called <b>kiddush</b> and bread is eaten called <b>challah</b>	-The <b>church</b> is a special place for <b>Christians</b> - <b>Churches</b> can be very different from each other but all are <b>special</b> to <b>Christians</b> - <b>Christians</b> meet together in church to <b>worship God</b> -They will listen to stories about <b>Jesus</b> , sing, pray and sit quietly

<b>Key Knowledge</b>	<p>-Everyone is tempted to do/say the wrong thing at times</p> <p>-The <b>gospel</b> stories feature the temptation of <b>Jesus</b> before he began his <b>ministry</b></p> <p>-The stories show how <b>Jesus</b> was made stronger and wiser by his temptation because he could have taken an easier path but rejected this</p> <p>-There are stories of temptation in the <b>Hebrew Scriptures</b> too</p> <p>-An example is the <b>story of the Golden Calf</b> when the <b>Jewish</b> people were also tempted</p>	<p>-<b>Holy</b> means someone or something <b>dedicated to God</b></p> <p>-For many <b>Christians, Mary</b> is an example of a <b>Holy</b> person, because she obeys <b>God</b> always and is the mother of <b>Jesus, the Son of God</b></p> <p>-<b>Catholic Christians</b> especially have <b>statues, stained glass, hymns and prayers</b> that are directed to <b>Mary</b> as a very important <b>Holy</b> person</p> <p>-Artwork about <b>Mary</b> often shows her as <b>Holy</b> (for example, by using a <b>halo</b>) and as the mother of <b>Jesus</b></p>	<p>-<b>Creation</b> means the act or process of making something.</p> <p>-The Judeo-Christian creation story is found in the book of <b>Genesis</b> in the <b>Old Testament</b>.</p> <p>-There are actually two creation stories in the book of Genesis</p> <p>-One describes <b>God</b> creating the world from nothing in 6 days and resting on the 7<sup>th</sup>.</p> <p>-The other story goes on to emphasise God creating <b>Adam and Eve</b>.</p> <p>-There are a number of stories about the creation of the world in <b>Hindu traditions</b>.</p> <p>-Life is seen as part of a whole <b>continuing cycle of creating, preserving and destroying</b> and creating again.</p> <p>-One Hindu story shows how the deities of <b>Vishnu</b>,</p>	<p>-A <b>ritual</b> is a <b>religious</b> or solemn <b>ceremony</b> with a series of actions in a set order</p> <p>-<b>Christians</b> use the <b>Paschal Candle</b> in a ritual at <b>Easter</b> time to symbolise the <b>risen Christ</b></p> <p>-The <b>Paschal Candle</b> has a <b>cross</b>, the current year and the Greek letters <b>alpha and omega</b></p> <p>-These show the <b>Christian belief</b> that Jesus is always here</p> <p>-The candle is also used in <b>Baptism and death rituals</b> to remind <b>Christians</b> about <b>Jesus' resurrection</b> and their belief in <b>life after death</b></p>	<p>-<b>Mahashivatri</b> is a <b>Hindu festival</b> dedicated to Shiva.</p> <p>-<b>Shiva</b> is the <b>Hindu God</b> who destroys the <b>universe</b>.</p> <p>-Mahashivatri is the day to <b>honour</b> and celebrate <b>Lord Shiva</b>.</p> <p>-Shiva is offered special food made from the <b>fruits of the season</b>, root vegetables, and coconuts.</p> <p>-Most people spend the day of <b>Mahashivatri</b> in <b>prayer, meditation and celebration</b>.</p> <p>-It is celebrated in the winter months.</p> <p>-<b>Hindu's</b> will <b>fast</b>. This means that do not eat anything.</p>	<p>-A <b>symbol</b> is something that represents or stands for something else</p> <p>-Stones are used as symbols in <b>religious practice and writings</b>.</p> <p>-Within the <b>bible</b> there are a number of references to the use of stones/rock – resembles: <b>firmness, a defense, a support or a refuge</b>.</p> <p>-Stones are used by <b>Zen Buddhists</b> as symbols within the gardens to aid <b>meditation</b>.</p>

<b>Key Knowledge</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-There are many practices and beliefs that help <b>Muslims belong</b> to their religion</li> <li>-The <b>Five Pillars of Islam</b> are an important way of helping <b>Muslims</b> all over the world belong to their religion</li> <li>-The Shahadah is the first of the Five Pillars of Islam.</li> <li>-<b>Shahadah</b> is the Muslim creed/statement of faith.</li> <li>-A key way of belonging in Islam is to recite and believe in the <b>Shahada</b>.</li> <li>-<b>Salat</b> (Muslim prayer)</li> <li>-Muslims are allowed to pray in any clean place, but often they will come together at <b>Mosque</b> to pray.</li> <li>-Muslims pray 5 times a day.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-The story about the birth of Jesus is found in two of the four <b>gospels – Matthew and Luke</b></li> <li>-It is not in the other two <b>gospels of Mark and John</b> at all</li> <li>-The two stories have similarities, such as <b>Jesus</b> is born in <b>Bethlehem</b> and the family make their home in <b>Nazareth</b></li> <li>-The two stories have differences, such as the <b>shepherds in Luke</b> and the <b>wise men in Matthew</b></li> <li>-This is because each of the <b>gospel</b> writers interpreted the story of <b>Jesus</b> in a way that highlighted what was important to them as a writer</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-There are references to <b>creation</b> throughout the <b>Qur'an</b></li> <li>-<b>Muslims</b> believe that <b>Allah</b> created the world and all living creatures in 6 days</li> <li>-<b>Allah</b> also created the first humans</li> <li>-<b>Khalifah</b> is a <b>guardian</b> of the world and <b>Muslims</b> believe that it is the job of everyone to look after the world</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-The <b>festivals of Christmas</b> and <b>Easter</b> are the most important <b>Christian</b> festivals</li> <li>-The <b>Easter</b> story in the <b>gospels</b> tells the story of how <b>Jesus</b> died and what happened after this</li> <li>-<b>Christians</b> believe that <b>Jesus's</b> death was not the end because he <b>rose</b> from the dead and appeared to his <b>followers</b></li> <li>-Some <b>followers</b> did not believe this until they had seen him with their own eyes</li> <li>-<b>Christians</b> believe that <b>Jesus</b> is still with them today</li> <li>-<b>Christians</b> today celebrate <b>Jesus' new life</b> on <b>Easter Sunday</b> and give <b>Easter</b> eggs as a sign of <b>new life</b>.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-A <b>sacred</b> place offers a <b>focal point</b> for people from that religion</li> <li>-<b>Sacred</b> places are places to celebrate, to gather, to eat, to pray, to sing, be together and be alone, as well as other activities</li> <li>-They are a connection to something beyond the everyday life for a believer</li> <li>-<b>Sacred places</b> can be very diverse but each <b>sacred place</b> is important within a religion</li> <li>-They often contain <b>symbols</b> of ideas of importance in the religion (such as a cross, artwork, calligraphy, light)</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-<b>Umma</b> – The family (community) of Muslims <b>worldwide</b>.</li> <li>-<b>Mecca</b> is in <b>Saudi Arabia</b> and this is the <b>holiest</b> city in Islam.</li> <li>-<b>Community</b> – a group of people who belong together because of a shared characteristic.</li> <li>-The <b>hajj</b> is the <b>pilgrimage</b>, or <b>religious journey</b>, every adult Muslim must make to the <b>holy city</b> of Mecca in Saudi Arabia.</li> <li>-The Five Pillars of Islam are five <b>duties</b> that are expected of every Muslim. The hajj is the 5<sup>th</sup> pillar.</li> <li>-<b>Zakat</b> is the third Pillar of Islam.</li> <li>-Many Muslims donate some of their money to <b>charity</b>. This is called <b>Zakah</b>.</li> </ul>
