<b>Key Knowledge</b>	-A <b>Christian</b> child will often go to <b>church</b> -They show they belong by taking part in activities there -Activities can be singing, listening to stories, Sunday school, going to a <b>service</b> -The <b>Christian</b> special book is called the <b>Bible</b> -The <b>Bible</b> has stories about stories about <b>Jesus</b> in it.	- <b>Christians</b> celebrate the birth of <b>Jesus</b> on <b>Christmas Day</b> -They remember how he was born in <b>Bethlehem</b> a long time ago and think about this at <b>Christmas</b> -They tell the <b>Nativity</b> story as a way of reminding themselves about how <b>Jesus</b> was born -They celebrate by sending cards that remind others about the birth of Jesus, going to special <b>Christmas services</b> , singing <b>hymns</b> about <b>Jesus</b> , having a <b>crib</b> displayed at home and giving presents. -There are many other ways they may choose to celebrate too	- <b>Jesus</b> told many <b>stories</b> to help his followers learn -He told <b>stories about God</b> and about how to behave -These <b>stories</b> show how <b>God</b> looks after people -They also show how <b>Christians</b> should care for others	- <b>Easter</b> is a very important <b>Christian</b> festival -Christians tell the <b>Easter</b> story to remind them about how <b>Jesus</b> died and then <b>rose again</b> - <b>Christians</b> celebrate Jesus' <b>new life</b> on <b>Easter Sunday</b> and give <b>Easter</b> eggs as a sign of <b>new life</b> .	- <b>Christians</b> have many special things -These might include a <b>cross</b> , a <b>Bible</b> , pictures of <b>Jesus</b> - <b>Jewish</b> people have many special things too -These might include a copy of the <b>Jewish special book</b> ; the <b>Hebrew Bible</b> and going to see the <b>Torah scrolls</b> in the <b>synagogue</b>	- <b>Christians</b> use water in a special ceremony called <b>baptism</b> which welcomes people into the church -Babies or adults can be <b>baptised</b> -Babies and adults often wear special clothing -Christians tell the story of <b>John of Baptist</b> who <b>baptised Jesus</b> in the river <b>Jordan</b> - <b>Hindus</b> see the <b>River Ganges</b> as <b>precious</b> . They travel a long way to bathe in the water - <b>Hindus</b> tell the story of <b>Shiva</b> who let the <b>River Ganges</b> flow through his hair

<b>Key Knowledge</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>Christians</b> celebrate the food they have at <b>Harvest</b> time in the Autumn</li> <li>-At <b>Harvest</b>, many <b>Christians</b> go to church to celebrate in a special <b>Harvest service</b></li> <li>-They sing songs, <b>pray</b> and often give to <b>charity</b> to help others without food.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Candles are used to remember someone or something</li> <li>-A <b>Hannukiah</b> is a special <b>Jewish menorah</b> lamp to remind <b>Jews</b> of the <b>miracle</b> of the oil at <b>Hanukkah</b></li> <li>-It has 9 candles, one for each night of the 8 nights of the <b>festival of Hanukkah</b> plus a <b>helper candle</b></li> <li>-The <b>festival of Hannukah</b> celebrates the <b>belief</b> in the <b>miracle</b> of one small jar of oil lasting 8 nights instead of 1 night as usual</li> <li>-<b>Christians</b> also use light at <b>Christmas</b></li> <li>-An example is the <b>Advent ring/wreath</b> which has 4 candles</li> <li>-A candle is lit on each of the 4 Sundays leading up to <b>Christmas</b></li> <li>-It reminds Christians to <b>wait</b> and prepare for Christmas light</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>Christians</b> believe that <b>Jesus changed</b> people's lives when he met them.</li> <li>-There are 3 stories in the <b>gospels</b> that we have learnt that show this</li> <li>-<b>Zacchaeus the tax collector</b> was hated by people because of his job. He changed when he met Jesus and gave back what he had stolen from others</li> <li>-<b>Jairus' daughter</b> was <b>brought back to life</b> by Jesus and Jairus changed by <b>believing</b> in Jesus and following him afterwards</li> <li>-Jesus brought sight back to the <b>blind</b> man and the man had faith that Jesus could do this.</li> <li>-<b>Christians</b> use these stories to show that Jesus can change the lives of anyone who believes in him.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-There are <b>sad and happy</b> parts to the <b>Easter</b> story</li> <li>-<b>Jesus</b> had a meal with his <b>disciples</b> to celebrate the <b>Jewish festival of Passover</b></li> <li>-This is called the <b>Last Supper</b></li> <li>-The <b>disciples</b> were happy to be together but <b>Jesus</b> was sad as he knew one of them would hand him over to the <b>Roman</b> Soldiers</li> <li>-<b>Jesus</b> was <b>arrested</b> by the soldiers and he was killed</li> <li>-His followers came to the place where he was buried but the stone had been rolled away and his body was not there</li> <li>-His followers were happy when <b>Jesus</b> appeared to them some time later</li> <li>-<b>Christians</b> believe from this story that Jesus died and rose again. This is called the <b>resurrection</b> and <b>Christians</b> celebrate this at <b>Easter</b>.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-We all belong to different <b>communities</b></li> <li>-There are always people who may need help in any community</li> <li>-<b>Dāna</b> is a very important value in <b>Hindu</b> traditions</li> <li>-<b>Dāna</b> involves helping people without expecting anything in return</li> <li>-The story of <b>Karna's generosity</b> shows the value of generosity to others</li> </ul>	<p><b>Shabbat</b> begins every week from sunset on Friday to sunset on Saturday</p> <p>-It is the <b>Jewish</b> day of rest</p> <p>-<b>Shabbat</b> remembers the story of creation from the <b>Torah</b></p> <p>-The story tells how <b>God created</b> the world in 6 days and rested on the 7<sup>th</sup> day</p>

<b>Key Knowledge</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>Sukkot</b> is an important celebration for <b>Jewish</b> people</li> <li>-It is the <b>Jewish</b> harvest festival and lasts for a week</li> <li>-<b>Sukkot</b> means Huts</li> <li>-<b>Jews</b> prepare by building and decorating their own special hut called a <b>sukkah</b></li> <li>-The <b>Sukkah</b> has 3 walls and becomes a part of the home</li> <li>-It reminds Jews of the <b>exodus</b> from <b>Egypt</b> and the dwellings made by <b>Moses</b> and his people who lived for 40 years in the wilderness</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>In many stories, the <b>end of the journey</b> is very important</li> <li>-The <b>Christian Nativity</b> story is told in two of the <b>four gospels</b> in the <b>Bible</b></li> <li>-The story tells how <b>Jesus</b> was born in <b>Bethlehem</b></li> <li>-In the story, <b>Mary</b> and <b>Joseph</b> travel to <b>Bethlehem</b> and at the end of the journey, <b>Mary</b> gives birth to <b>Jesus</b></li> <li>-The <b>shepherds</b> also go on a journey to see Jesus and find him at the end of the journey</li> <li>-The <b>magi (wise men)</b> go on a journey to see Jesus and find him at the end of their journey</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-The <b>Seder</b> plate helps <b>Jews</b> remember a special story called the <b>Passover</b></li> <li>-The story of the <b>Passover</b> is found in the <b>Torah</b>, the first five books of the <b>Hebrew scriptures</b></li> <li>-It is remembered at a special festival of <b>Passover</b> each year</li> <li>-<b>Passover</b> tells the story of how <b>Jews</b> were led out of <b>Egypt</b> and <b>slavery</b> by <b>Moses</b></li> <li>-The <b>Seder</b> meal has special foods in it to help remember parts of the story: bitter herbs, a lamb bone, celery or parsley, paste made of fruit and nuts and a hard boiled egg</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-<b>Welcoming</b> is being polite or friendly to someone who is new</li> <li>-Jesus was <b>Jewish</b> and was in <b>Jerusalem</b> with his friends (disciples) to celebrate the <b>Jewish</b> festival of <b>Passover</b></li> <li>-He came into Jerusalem riding a horse and he was welcomed by a crowd waving <b>palm leaves</b> at him.</li> <li>-Many people were excited to see him because they knew about him</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-People <b>belong</b> to different groups for different reasons</li> <li>-A key way <b>Jewish</b> people feel they belong to their religion is through observing the <b>Shabbat</b> each week</li> <li>-This is a day of rest with no work undertaken</li> <li>-The <b>Shabbat</b> reminds them that G-d created the world in 6 days and on the 7<sup>th</sup> day G-d rested</li> <li>-It begins every Friday at sunset for 25 hours</li> <li>-A <b>Shabbat</b> meal is eaten on the Friday evening</li> <li>-<b>Shabbat</b> candles are lit, there is a special ceremony to bless the wine or grape juice called <b>kiddush</b> and bread is eaten called <b>challah</b></li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-The <b>Hindu Mandir</b> is a special place for <b>Hindus</b></li> <li>-The Mandir is a <b>temple</b></li> <li>-Hindus go there to <b>worship</b> and treat it as a special place by the way they dress and behave there</li> <li>-Hindus worship there using their <b>five senses</b>: sight, sound, touch, taste and smell</li> <li>-The Mandir has images of <b>God</b> there which are called <b>murtis</b></li> <li>-The murtis help Hindus worship</li> <li>Hindus may also have a small shrine at home for <b>worship</b></li> </ul>

<b>Key Knowledge</b>	<p>-All <b>religions</b> have special stories with <b>messages</b> in</p> <p>-An important story for <b>Christians</b> is the <b>Parable of the Prodigal Son</b>, which shows how the father is like God in his <b>forgiveness</b></p> <p>-An important story for <b>Buddhists</b> is the story of <b>Kisa and the Mustard Seed</b>, which explains that everyone has to suffer and that sharing that suffering can help people</p> <p>-<b>Christians</b> and <b>Buddhists</b> use these stories to show how to live your life by the message in the story</p>	<p>-The word <b>angel</b> means messenger</p> <p><b>Angels</b> are important messengers from God in both the <b>Old Testament</b> and the <b>New Testament</b></p> <p><b>Angels</b> appear in both <b>Matthew</b> and <b>Luke</b>'s birth narratives</p> <p>-They appear to <b>Mary and Joseph</b> and the <b>shepherds</b></p> <p>-They highlight how important the birth of Jesus is and that Jesus is the <b>chosen one, the Messiah</b> who has come to save his people</p>	<p>-<b>Holi</b> is a 2 day <b>Hindu festival</b> in the Spring</p> <p>-On the first day people light bonfires and <b>remember</b> the story of <b>Prahlad</b>, the son of a <b>demon king</b></p> <p>-<b>Prahlad</b> was devoted to the <b>Hindu God Vishnu</b> and <b>worshiped</b> him instead of his father</p> <p>-The <b>demon king's</b> sister <b>Holika</b> tried to kill <b>Prahlad</b> in a fire, but her protective cloak flew off and protected <b>Prahlad</b> instead of her</p> <p>-The story <b>remembers</b> good overcoming evil</p> <p>-On the second day people throw coloured paint</p> <p>-Many <b>Hindus</b> play music, dance, retell the story, throw paint and share sweets</p>	<p>-The <b>Easter</b> story can be found in the <b>New Testament</b> of the <b>bible</b>.</p> <p>-<b>Christians</b> recognise <b>Jesus endured suffering</b> before and during his death.</p> <p>-Name different forms of suffering eg. <b>Key Knowledge</b>	-There are many practices and beliefs that help <b>Muslims</b> belong to their religion -The <b>Five Pillars of Islam</b> are an important way of helping <b>Muslims</b> all over the world belong to their religion -The Shahadah is the first of the Five Pillars of Islam. - <b>Shahadah</b> is the Muslim creed/statement of faith. -A key way of belonging in Islam is to recite and believe in the <b>Shahada</b> . - <b>Salat</b> (Muslim prayer) -Muslims are allowed to pray in any clean place, but often they will come together at <b>Mosque</b> to pray. -Muslims pray 5 times a day.	-The story about the birth of Jesus is found in two of the four <b>gospels</b> – <b>Matthew and Luke</b> -It is not in the other two <b>gospels of Mark and John</b> at all -The two stories have similarities, such as <b>Jesus</b> is born in <b>Bethlehem</b> and the family make their home in <b>Nazareth</b> -The two stories have differences, such as the <b>shepherds</b> in <b>Luke</b> and the <b>wise men</b> in <b>Matthew</b> -This is because each of the <b>gospel</b> writers interpreted the story of <b>Jesus</b> in a way that highlighted what was important to them as a writer	-There are references to <b>creation</b> throughout the <b>Qur'an</b> - <b>Muslims</b> believe that <b>Allah</b> created the world and all living creatures in 6 days - <b>Allah</b> also created the first humans - <b>Khalifah</b> is a <b>guardian</b> of the world and <b>Muslims</b> believe that it is the job of everyone to look after the world	-The <b>festivals of Christmas</b> and <b>Easter</b> are the most important <b>Christian</b> festivals -The <b>Easter</b> story in the <b>gospels</b> tells the story of how <b>Jesus</b> died and what happened after this - <b>Christians</b> believe that <b>Jesus</b> 's death was not the end because he <b>rose</b> from the dead and appeared to his <b>followers</b> -Some <b>followers</b> did not believe this until they had seen him with their own eyes - <b>Christians</b> believe that <b>Jesus</b> is still with them today - <b>Christians</b> today celebrate <b>Jesus' new life</b> on <b>Easter Sunday</b> and give <b>Easter</b> eggs as a sign of <b>new life</b> .	-A <b>sacred</b> place offers a <b>focal point</b> for people from that religion - <b>Sacred</b> places are places to celebrate, to gather, to eat, to pray, to sing, be together and be alone, as well as other activities -They are a connection to something beyond the everyday life for a believer - <b>Sacred places</b> can be very diverse but each <b>sacred place</b> is important within a religion -They often contain <b>symbols</b> of ideas of importance in the religion (such as a cross, artwork, calligraphy, light)	- <b>Umma</b> – The family (community) of Muslims worldwide. - <b>Mecca</b> is in <b>Saudi Arabia</b> and this is the <b>holiest</b> city in Islam. - <b>Community</b> – a group of people who belong together because of a shared characteristic. -The <b>hajj</b> is the <b>pilgrimage</b> , or <b>religious journey</b> , every adult Muslim must make to the <b>holy city</b> of Mecca in Saudi Arabia. -The Five Pillars of Islam are five <b>duties</b> that are expected of every Muslim. The hajj is the 5 <sup>th</sup> pillar. - <b>Zakat</b> is the third Pillar of Islam. -Many Muslims donate some of their money to <b>charity</b> . This is called <b>Zakah</b> .
