Our school day

8.55am - 12.00noon 1.00pm - 3.30pm (Key stage 2 children)

1.00pm - 3.20pm (Reception class and Key stage 1 children)

Attendance

Regular attendance is vital for children's learning and helps to build good habits for their future development. We take a collaborative approach in working with our families to promote good attendance across all year groups.

When a child is absent you need to tell us the reason for this on the first day before registration at 8.55am. Any unexplained absences are marked as unauthorised.

If children arrive after 8.55am this is recorded as late. Hampshire County Council monitors all school attendance and can issue fines for persistent absence or lateness. Following a change in legislation in 2013 we're not allowed to authorise holiday applications for absence during term time.

Children are encouraged to come into their class from 8.45am where learning can start straight away.

The register is taken between 8.45am and 8.55am.



School uniform

Beaulieu Village Primary is proud of its reputation and our uniform is to be worn at all times during the school day. The school colours are red, blue and grey.

Outdoor learning

We're passionate about giving our children access to the rich outdoor space that our beautiful New Forest surroundings provide. At Beaulieu Village Primary children experience traditional country school life. This means when they're not in the classroom they get to make dens, play with mud, climb, play sport, do gardening and look for bugs and birds. We also encourage them to take time for quiet reflection under the trees on our school field.

PE kit

This consists of:

Navy shorts, red school t-shirts, plimsolls and trainers for outdoor sports. During colder weather, where activities take place outside, children are encouraged to bring tops and jogging bottoms for warmth.

PE kit is kept at school at all times during term time, as timetables can change.





Wild play

We have a designated wild play area where all children have the opportunity to experiment, create, problem solve and take risks supported by older children, parents and staff.

Wild play is intrinsically linked to our school curriculum and allows our children to build a wider range of lifelong skills including self-esteem, problem-solving, teamwork, responsibility, health and safety, and creativity.

Wild play leaders

Designated wild play leaders (staff, parents and our older children) lead all sessions and class teachers have the time to observe and assess the children as they learn in new ways.

Wild play kit

Because wild play goes on in all weathers the following kit is essential:

Waterproof jacket (and waterproof trousers if available) Gloves

- Hat
- Wellies

Music



As well as curriculum-based music lessons children can join our school choir and access one-to-one lessons covering a range of instruments offered by our excellent music teachers. Lessons can be bought as a block of weekly lessons and include guitar, piano, violin, flute and saxophone.

Curriculum and assessment

Our curriculum is key to the way we inspire our children here at Beaulieu. In addition to the National Curriculum requirements it focuses on children learning a wider range of skills within themed topic areas. These topics are carefully planned to fully engage our children and to make the most of the opportunities provided by our beautiful setting. All our children also take part in school trips as part of an annual programme that includes two residential trips in key stage 2.

Children's progress is continually tracked and regular performance updates are shared during termtime consultations and an end-of-year report. You can also access information about your children's progress and wellbeing at any time should you have any concerns.

In May our Year Six children sit Standard Assessment Tests (SATs). Then every June, Year One children have a Phonics Screening Test. Other non-statutory tests that we use alongside our teacher assessments include: Foundation Stage Profiling (early years' assessments used in reception class), phonics screening tests, reading and spelling age tests, non-statutory SATs in maths and English.

Breakfast club

Our breakfast club runs from 7.45am to 8.45am Monday to Friday. The club includes a healthy breakfast choice of cereals, toast, fruit, milk and fruit juice. After breakfast children take part in a range of activities such as art and craft, outdoor games and sport and problem-solving puzzles.

Each session costs £3.50 and bookings are taken on a halftermly basis. If you have concerns about paying upfront for the whole half term please speak to us about an individual payment plan.

Early bird club

We also offer an early bird club from 8.15am at a cost of £2 per session. Breakfast is not included but all other activities are.

Admissions

Parents of new admission children for Reception can write or telephone the school to register their interest. We will then send you invitations to our open events and information will also appear on our website.

Parents can apply for a place for their child in our September Reception Class online at <u>https://www.hants.gov.uk/educationandlearning/admissions</u> from mid-November until the closing date in mid-January of each year.

Full details will be available on this website including guidance on the process of applying. Alternatively, parents can contact Hampshire County Council on 0300 555 1377 to make a telephone application or request a paper form. Those parents who submit their application between the required dates will receive their offer of a place in April.

During the summer term, prior to the new intake in September, there will be many opportunities for parents and new admission children to visit the school and talk to staff, including a series of "stay and play" sessions. Children are accepted into school once a year in the September following their 4th birthday. If you are wishing to enter your child at any other time, please make an appointment to look around the school.
