# **Core Learning**

#### **English**

The children will use the text 'Meerkat Mail' written by Emily Gravett to explore a range of different genres.

# **Writing outcomes include:**

- \* Missing Poster
- \* Postcard
- \*Letter
- \* Non-chronological report

# These outcomes will involve the following skills:

- \*writing accurate sentences with a capital letter, finger spaces, a full stop or a question mark or exclamation mark as appropriate
- \*using adjectives for added description (noun phrases)
- \*using commas when writing a list (Y2).
- \*writing sentences using the word 'and' (Y1)
- \*writing compound sentences using and/but/so and complex sentences using because (Y2)
- \*using apostrophes for contraction (Y2)
- \* re-reading own writing to check for sense
- \*developing their editing skills (with support)

#### **Phonics**

The children will have a daily 20 minutes phonics lesson.

#### Reading Squad: x3 a wk

During 'reading squad', the children will read books that are linked to their phonic knowledge and reading level.

In these 3 sessions, we will focus on:

- -decoding
- -vocabulary
- -prosody (expression)
- -comprehension

The book will be sent home in a plastic wallet.

## **Maths**

We will be focusing on improving our ability to understand and manipulate number.

This learning will include:

- \* Place value:
- within 10 (Y1)
- -within 100 (Y2)
- \* Addition and subtraction
- within 10 (Y1)
- -within 100 (Y2)
- \*(Y1) count forwards, backwards, one more, one less
- \*(Y2) count in 2s, 5s, 10s and 3s.

Problem solving and mental maths will run through all elements of the maths teaching.

#### **Science**


We will be focusing on 'The Human Body".

The children will name, identify, draw and label different parts of the human body. They will also focus on their senses, looking at sound, touch, taste and smell. They will identify which part of the body is used for which sense. Throughout their science learning journey they will work scientifically and perform simple tests.

#### **PSHE – Get Heartsmart**

The children will follow the school's PSHE programme 'Heartsmart', where this half term -focus is 'Get Hearsmart'.

- •beginning to understand that my choices can help or hurt my own and others hearts.
- •beginning to understand that I am a source of power.
- •beginning to understand some different emotions I feel.
- •beginning to understand that I can look after my heart.
- •identify someone that I am grateful for and am beginning to think about a reason why.
- beginning to understand what healthy mind and body look like.



The children will:

- \*discuss and look at the artwork of Eddie Martinez.
- \*compare and contrast the work of Phyllida Barlow.
- \*plan materials they will use for a recycling sculpture.
- \*select materials and start to create a structure using techniques demonstrated.
- \*create a colour plan for their sculpture.
- \*draw a sketch of their sculpture.
- \*evaluate their own and others work.



# PE -Gym and Games

Y1 P.E is taught on a Monday and Friday. Y2 P.E is taught on a Tuesday and Friday. PE kit needs to be worn on a Wed too!

We will be covering:

\*Gymnastics – Static balance, core strength, weight bearing, crossing midline, coordination. \*Co-operative Games + Fundamental movement skills.



# Music – Musical vocabulary Unit outcomes
