**William – Year 6** I talked to the gentleman on my table. He was really friendly and kind. He told me every day he's trying to enjoy himself and do something for a good time.



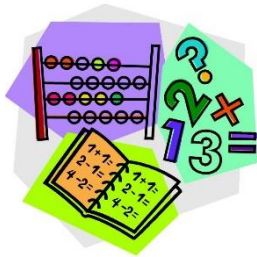




## Reading Resources – A plea from Mrs Burt

## Maths Week 13<sup>th</sup> – 17<sup>th</sup> November

A message from our Maths Lead and head of Key Stage 2, Mrs Cunningham:

As you know, we are taking part in Maths Week England. Here is a reminder of some of the fantastic activities we have planned for the children:

### England Rocks (Times Tables Rock Stars Competition)

If your child has a TTRS log in then this competition is for them!

The competition runs from **07:30 GMT Tuesday 14th November 2023 to 19:30 GMT Thursday 16th November 2023**. Children can play in any game mode with every correct answer to a multiplication or division question earning themselves, their class and the school a point. The Times Tables Rock Stars platform will calculate the class average.

To support children's wellbeing, there is a daily time limit of 60-minutes per player. Once the player goes beyond 60-minutes of play on that day, they will still earn coins but will no longer earn points towards the competition.

### How many/ how much competition

Each day in the office there will be a container with a counted-out number of edible items or with a weighed quantity on display. Children can come in and estimate how many are in there/ how heavy it is and the child with the correct amount (or the closest number) at the end of the day will win the container. Please encourage your child to get involved!

### Photography competition

We would also love you to get involved with our Maths All Around Us challenge. Can you find examples of where maths is used when you are out and about? How creative can you get? (For example, cylinder-shaped car wheels, numbers displayed on doors, supermarket price labels). We'd love you to either print your photos out and bring them in, or email them to the office.

### Multiply Games evening - Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> November

Come and have fun with the Multiply team. Take a break and share dedicated time with your children away from screens, playing games which encourage mathematical thinking. This is a FREE event for all ages! **Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> November from 3.15-5.15** in Oak classroom. ### Dress up day Friday 17<sup>th</sup> November - come in as a Rock Star

# Years 1 and 2 Football Tournament





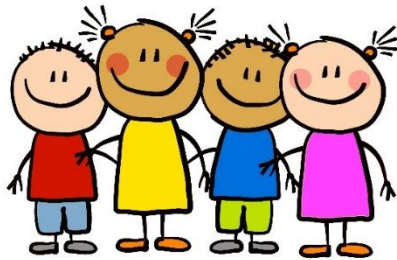
A report from Mr Toomer:

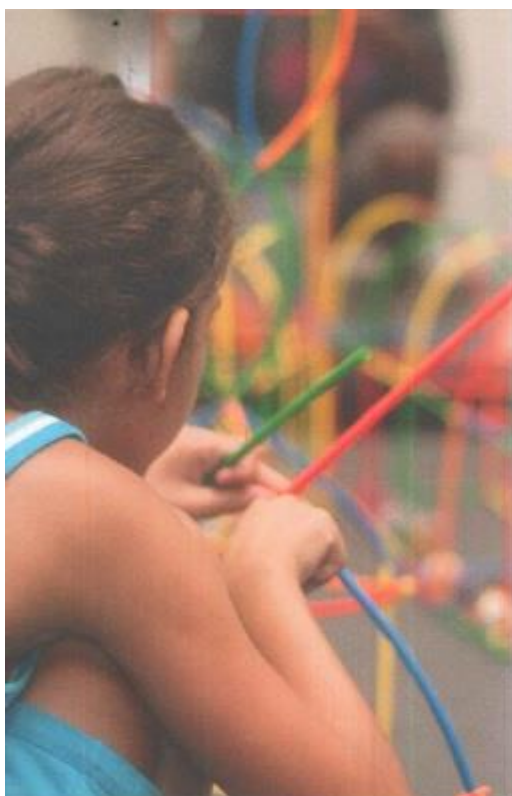
YFM IS THE COMMUNITY PROJECT OF
