Team B came in 4th -



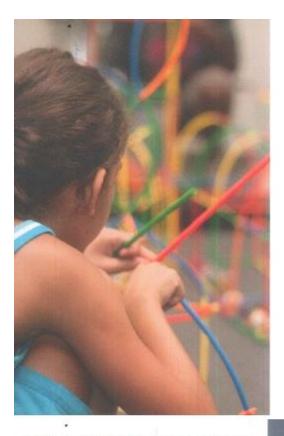
## **AUTISM & ADHD SUPPORT GROUP**

## MANAGING YOUR Child's Angry Feelings

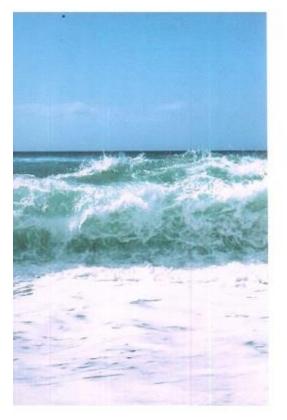
Six week course
