### **Annual Beaulieu Pancake Races**

This year is the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of our Beaulieu Pancake Races. (We feel sure they happened in the past but then obviously stopped for a while!) Jan Hoy, now in her eighties, and her small band of helpers, have been organising this event for 20 years and we are very grateful to them.

This year's races will be opened by Lady Montagu.

If you are new to this event, or if, like me, you can't remember things which happened a year ago, here is some information to help you.

#### When does it start?

The races will start at 2.00 pm when the High Street is closed to traffic. The children will come out a little before 2.00 and stand along the pavement.

### How long does it last?

The road is closed until 3.00 pm. At about that time the children will go back into school, but you can then collect your child and take them to the village hall for pancakes if you would like to.

### What happens?

The children will race first, in their year groups. Please cheer and clap as loudly as you can! After the children's races, there are some races between community groups, such as the Montagu Arms, the fire fighters, the Beaulieu estate and parents from our school. This year we will also have a walking pancake race for adults who may prefer not to run!

If you would like to take part in the community races – and we know the children would love to watch you! – **Please consider putting a parent team together**. We need 4 people in a team. If you can make a team, please let Lisa in the school office know (01590 612255). In the unlikely event we get too many

teams we will work on a first come, first served basis to prevent this event going on into the night!

After the races there will be a pancake tossing competition which parents are encouraged to join in with on the day!

### What if my child doesn't want to take part?

No child is forced to take part! The children are encouraged, but they can always say no if they want to. It's a fun event and most children really enjoy it. Occasionally teachers will judge that the experience may not be quite right for a particular child, in which case they will always try to talk to parents first.

#### Where should we stand?

**Please stand along the pavement on the opposite side of the road to the school.** The children need to stand with their teachers, on the opposite side of the road, so that staff can see the children clearly at all times.

### What happens at the end?

Teachers will take the children back into school and then dismiss them in the normal manner so we can be sure each child goes with the right adult. **Please don't come into the school car park until all the children are safely inside**. Thank you.


