# **Annual Visit of Hampshire Inspector**

On Wednesday we had our annual Local Authority Review visit (not OFSTED as some of our children thought!).

Throughout the day the inspector visited classrooms, spoke to children, and scrutinised work. She noted how calm the children's classrooms were and how focused and engaged they were themselves. During the learning walks, our children really shone, demonstrating excellent behaviour and lovely manners, and talking with great enthusiasm about their learning.

Our inspector was particularly impressed by how interventions are used in the classrooms to target gaps in learning or to extend and deepen learning with "not one second of the school day wasted."

Governors and I were delighted that our inspector praised the strength and dedication of our fabulous teaching team (by which I mean teachers and support staff).

She worked with several of our leaders, including our two senior leaders (Mrs Cunningham our Key Stage 2 and maths lead and Mrs Burt our Key Stage 1 and reading lead), Mrs Stroud our SENCO, Mrs Lawlor our writing lead and Mrs Kedzierski ("Mrs K") our science lead. Our inspector found all these leaders to be knowledgeable and highly credible, which governors and I also know to be the case.

We were able to show case Mrs Cunningham's strong vision for maths in our school, including her research into technology to boost learning (for example the use of Numbots in Key Stage 1, TTRS in Key Stage 2 and White Rose videos on Google Classroom).

Our inspector also saw that the Little Wandle phonics/reading programme, led with so much passion and determination by Mrs Burt, and so well supported by families, is having real impact.

Our next steps focus on further refining our carefully designed whole school curriculum.

We also need to improve whole school attendance. As you would expect, the local authority are monitoring attendance very carefully because of it's impact on children's progress.




