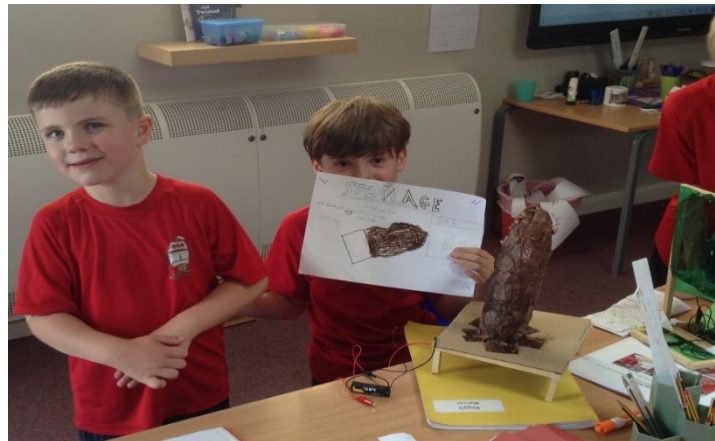
Terrific Technology

Mrs Doman, our amazing DT lead, is so proud of her Year 3 and 4 children:

In their DT lessons this half term, Chestnut and Maple children researched different nightlights and then designed and made a nightlight for a younger child who was afraid of the dark. They made a wooden frame for the base of their night light and a paper mâché light shade. They then assembled all the components including the electrical circuit for the light to work.

The children needed to 'market' their final product and produce a leaflet or poster to inform clients about why their nightlight was the best.

Willow (Year R) children were invited to look at the night lights and encouraged to say which was their favourite. (I was asked by one if they could buy it!)

British Values

Our staff and governors recognise that learning about the British Values and experiencing diversity within their curriculum is particularly important for our children.

Beaulieu is a beautiful place in which to be educated. It is rich in community, history and tradition. But it is not naturally diverse.

We need to ensure our children come across people from a range of cultural, religious and family backgrounds. This happens in many ways, including through books, resources, trips, visits and discussions.

Our new Jigsaw programme has been specially chosen to enrich our curriculum and to help us better prepare our children for life in modern Britain.

Mrs Burt has been selecting books to go on her wish list for our new library. She is passionate that each of our children needs to have books which reflect their

own lives (heroes and heroines who are a lot like them), as well as books which enable them to experience diversity.

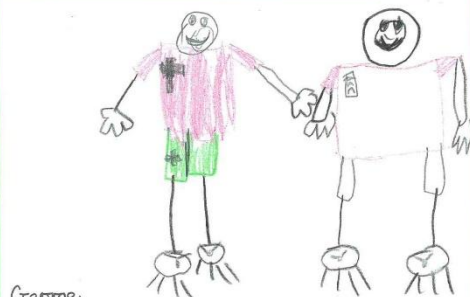
The British Values we explore with our children are:

Democracy
Rule of Law
Individual liberty
Tolerance
Mutual respect

In our discussions this half term, we are focussing on **tolerance** and **respect**. Here are some wise words from a few of our younger children:

Valient Vikings

Mrs Sabo arranged for our Year 3 and 4 children to be archaeologists for the morning! Using resources from the Hampshire History Centre, they took part in a Viking dig, excavating Viking artefacts that were found at the site of a Viking settlement. They uncovered items such as: Viking coins, a flint strike, a horn cup and a bone whistle.



William – Year 4 We watched a video filmed in the North of Yorkshire. 2 metal detectorists had found a piece of metal. They phoned up and at first, they said “Oh it might just be an old bottle or something” but then the men used some interesting words, and they came and found tons of Viking treasure!

Charlotte – Year 4 We were archaeologists looking for treasures the Vikings may have left behind. We worked one square at a time to really focus. We had to brush off all the sand and look deeply at each artefact.

Police Visit to Year R



As part of their learning about People Who Help Us, Willow Class had a visit from two police officers, Amy and Glen (Alice and Amy's dad!). The officers brought along their police car and let the children take turns to sit inside and switch the siren on.

All the adults were touched by how excited the children were and by what a joyful visit this was!

Adam: They let us in their police car – in the front! I holded the steering wheel.

Niyah: And I beeped the horn. (It's ok - they let us!)

Kai: I liked putting the helmet on and I liked being a real police officer.

Leah: I remember that they actually told us how to be safe, and they showed us what things they wore.

Jack: I went into the police car, and I had a little drive. (Not real – pretend!)

Oleta: That's me with the helmet on. I felt happy.
