Building children's resilience

Teachers are highly focused on supporting children to build resilience. Life, as we know, is full of ups and downs and the ability to bounce back can be one of the most important factors in how happy, healthy and successful we are.

We have noticed a particular need to build resilience since we returned to school after the periods of lock down.

Of course our children must always be safe and they need to feel loved and valued. However, small problems, such as a minor falling out with a friend or work which is tricky and takes time and thought to complete, are great opportunities for children to be supported to show resilience.

In our school, resilience is linked to our value of Courage and is something we talk about and celebrate constantly. Mistakes and problems are opportunities for learning and growth! Teachers avoid jumping in to solve small problems for children, but show them that they believe they can manage themselves, with a little support.

Bullying must never be tolerated but minor problems which occur with friendships or at playtimes can be tackled by adults asking questions such as "What do you think you will do about this?" "What would you like to see happen?" "How could we sort this out?" Similarly no child would be left to struggle alone with school work which was distressing them, but a degree of challenge and difficulty is important for learning. Rather than telling a child how to solve a problem — or taking the problem away — teachers will express their confidence that the child will be able to figure it out for themselves and, if necessary, remind them about resources and strategies which could help them.

Reading regularly at home and completing short, age-appropriate, pieces of homework without their teacher being present are important ways of building children's independence and resilience. Please talk to us if you have concerns.

We strongly believe that children who are supported to show resilience and who see themselves as resilient will be more likely to thrive in the future. We're very grateful for your support in reinforcing this approach with your child at home.

Zoja "I think it's growing, it's taking a long time but it is getting bigger.




