### **Maths Workshops for Parents**

children's mathematics have become higher and this is certainly the case.

### Attendance

As you know, good attendance is extremely important to children's academic progress and to their life chances. We have adopted a new system to assist in monitoring attendance called Arbor. This will change the way we inform you

about your child's attendance and will allow you to log on directly to see information for yourself.

95% attendance is considered satisfactory (9 days absence over the course of the year) and 90% is classed as persistent absence, which is a serious concern (19 days absence over the course of the year). Arbor will automatically generate letters for the parents of children who are in the persistent absence category (regardless of the causes of the absence).

These letters will replace the old "traffic light" letters.

As a school, we will work with families where children's absence is in the persistent category to try to make improvements as quickly as possible. Mrs Thorne, our attendance officer, will contact the parents of children whose attendance falls below 90% as a matter of course.

A couple of weeks ago, our Year 1 and Year 2 children visited the New Forest Wildlife Park to support their science learning.


The teachers were proud of the children's lovely behaviour and impressed by their enthusiasm.



what is appropriate to say and what isn't, nor the fact that written comments can have a different lasting impact from verbal ones.


