Super Science!






Quin – Year 6 In science we have been mixing new substances to observe the reaction. This is part of learning about reversible and irreversible changes.

Esme – Year 6 We mixed vinegar and bicarbonate of soda. The mixture rose up really high and then collapsed – we noticed how smelly it was! We also mixed pasta, flour and rice together. This was a reversible change because you could use a sieve or a colander to separate them.

Noah – Year 5 We mixed a vitamin C tablet in water. It went orange and smelled like fanta! You obviously couldn't reverse the change. We wanted to investigate with plaster of Paris and water, but this was too dangerous in our school so we watched a video. If you accidentally drop it on you it quickly hardens.

Felix – Year 6 We also mixed lemon and bicarbonate of soda. It fizzed straight to the top and didn't go to a clear liquid but left small lumps and bubbles. It smelt like French Toast!



Attendance and Sickness

As you know, we are particularly concerned to maximise our children's learning after the disruption of the past couple of years. Good attendance is a huge factor in making good academic progress.

If your child is physically sick he or she needs to stay at home for 48 hours to protect the school community. Children with high temperatures should also not be in school.

It can be more difficult for families to decide, with other forms of illness, whether children need to stay home or not. **If you are in doubt, we would encourage you to bring your child to school and to let a member of staff know**. We will not hesitate to contact you if your child seems unable to cope or if they deteriorate during the day.
