HM the Queen

Since writing this newsletter, the death of Her Majesty the Queen has sadly been announced.

We have been talking to our children about Queen Elizabeth. Many of them have a real awareness of her, particularly following the recent Platinum Jubilee celebrations, and many are aware of the effect her death has had on adults.

We have had a short assembly and a minute's silence for the Queen today. We also talked about the flag outside the school flying at half-mast and we let the children listen to the church bells tolling for the Queen at midday.

We want to ensure our children have an age-appropriate understanding of the significance of the Queen's historic reign and a lasting memory of being part of our school and our Beaulieu village community when the Queen sadly died.

Our older children, in particular, will learn about how our village community, our country and the wider world are mourning the Queen.

Teachers may use lesson materials from the <u>Royal Collections Trust</u> and the <u>National Archives</u>. If you have any questions about how we will approach these

lessons, about our conversations with the children or about our school events, please talk to us.

It is possible that one or two of the dates at the bottom of this newsletter will change when we know more about the national plans for mourning the Queen's death.



Meet The Teacher

Teachers have prepared short talks to share with families on Google Classroom. The video for your child's class will let you know about the routines and expectations for this year. We hope the use of

Google Classroom will mean all parents and carers, including working parents and carers, can access the teachers' talks at a convenient time.

The Key Stage 2 videos will be available on Google Classroom by Friday 9th September and the Key Stage 1 videos (including the video for Early Years parents) will be available by Friday 16th September.

Before you can view the video, your child will need to log on to Google Classroom and accept an invitation to join. Login details will be sent to children who are new to our school (including our Early Years children). For all our other children, login details remain unchanged from last year.

Please do chat to your child's teacher in person or via Google Classroom to ask any questions you have after seeing the video – teachers are usually available to talk at the end of the school day. Questions can also be emailed to the school office if you prefer. Adminoffice@beaulieu.hants.sch.uk

I am also at the gate most mornings if you would like to chat to me, or you can make an appointment for a proper meeting with me via the school office (01590 612255) should you wish to.




Celebrating Children's Work

At the end of each half term, parents and carers will have an opportunity to come into school to see for themselves what children have been learning. In Key Stage 2 this will usually

involve popping into the classroom to look through your child's books with him or her.

In Key Stage 1 the children might sing to you, perform something for you, or show you things they have made.

Leadership and Courage





Each year children, particularly those in Year 6, are encouraged to put themselves forward for positions such as House Captain and School Councillor. We teach our children that being brave and "going for your opportunities" is valuable in itself, whether or not you are successful, and will make you more likely to show courage in the future.

We also take the opportunity to teach our children about democracy. Some positions of responsibility involve a short interview, others involve a fair vote by the class (in the case of school councillors) or by the whole House (in the case of House Captains).

If your child stands for election or applies for an interview, we really appreciate your support in encouraging them to feel proud of themselves for being brave, whether or not they are successful.



Attendance and Punctuality

As mentioned last term, we feel a strong responsibility to do the very best for all our children and this means ensuring good attendance and punctuality.

We want children to learn as well as possible now and also to establish the high standards which will benefit them in future learning and employment.


Even a small amount of learning missed through lateness or absence can cause gaps in children's learning and affect their progress.

Like other schools, we relaxed our approach from March 2022 to support families at a highly stressful time. Moving forward, absence will only be authorised for illness or in truly exceptional circumstances. Holidays will not be authorised.

As you may know, families of children who have five or more days of unauthorised absence within a ten week period automatically receive a fine. Fining families always makes us feel very uncomfortable and in fact the payment does not come to the school.

Please talk to me, to Lisa in the office or to Kerry (Thorne) if you have any questions or concerns about attendance. Kerry and I are both usually available at the gate in the morning.

Parent/Headteacher meetings





The meetings take place in our staffroom and are an opportunity to find out about what we are changing and why, as well as to ask any questions, raise any issues or make any suggestions to myself and Kerry Thorne (governor and family support officer.)

These meetings are open to all parents and carers. You are very welcome to just come along and listen or you can ask questions or make suggestions for yourself or on behalf of other parents who are unable to make the meeting.

Our first meeting will be on Thursday 6th October at 2.45 pm. We will be talking about why children will be putting their hands up less in lessons this year!

Please note: we never discuss individual children or members of staff – if you have a particular concern about your child it is always important to speak to your child's teacher.



Celebration Assemblies

A reminder that, this year, our assemblies will be held in the Village Hall **at 2.30 on Thursday afternoons**. Dates will appear in newsletters termly and assemblies

are usually held fortnightly.

Our first assembly will be next **Thursday 15th September at 2.30 pm**. You will receive a phone call if your child is going to receive a Heartsmart certificate, but all families are very welcome to attend and we would love to see you.

Please note our youngest children do not attend celebration assemblies until they join Year 1.

School Uniform

Thank you for sending the children back looking so smart!

Apologies that there has been some confusion over what children should be wearing to school on Wednesdays. The children will not normally have PE lessons on Wednesdays but some children will be involved in tournaments at Priestlands School and there will be inter-school tournaments for all children on some

Wednesdays.



To avoid having to communicate which children will be needing PE kit on a weekly basis (which could get quite complicated!), we think it is best for ALL children to wear PE kit to school.

On Mondays and Thursdays, children can choose from:

- Grey/black trousers, shorts, skirt or tunic dress or Blue and white checked summer dress
- Red polo shirt with or without school logo
- Blue sweatshirt or cardigan with or without school logo
- Sensible black school shoes

On P.E. days, Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays children need:

- Navy shorts, red school t-shirt (no buttons please) and trainers (any colour)
- During colder weather, where activities take place outside, children are encouraged to wear jogging bottoms and a school sweatshirt or red school P.E. hoodie for warmth

Please note, red school P.E. hoodies may be worn throughout the week if preferred.

Financial Pressure on Families

We are highly aware of the demands on our families in the current financial climate.

Please talk in confidence to me, to Lisa in the office, or to Kerry (our family support officer) if your family is facing particular pressure. We will be keeping our eyes open for all available help for families.

We would also be grateful to hear from you with any suggestions of practical ways in which we as a school might be able to support families in these difficult times.

Families are facing increasing costs and unfortunately so are schools. Our budget is under huge strain from a range of sources, including the dramatic increase in the cost of fuel.

Spaces


One of the most important ways for us to protect our budget is to fill any spaces in our classrooms.
