Great British Summer Savings Update

From 25 June to 1 September 2026, the Government is temporarily cutting VAT from 20% to 5% on children's meals in restaurants, children and family tickets to cinemas, theatres, concerts and exhibitions and admission to a wide range of attractions. Combined with free bus travel during August for children aged 5 to 15 in England, families and young people can enjoy experiences that make summer special, including visits to the kinds of cultural and educational attractions that enrich children's lives outside the classroom. As part of this campaign, an attraction finder website has been created which allows families to type in their postcode and find participating venues near them to make the most of summer savings. NCA Guidance to Parents: Children's Images Online

The National Crime Agency and Internet Watch Foundation have issued new guidance to help parents make informed choices about sharing images of their children online. It covers reviewing privacy settings, revisiting consent with your child as they grow and what to do if you're worried.
